


Neighbourhood Plan Survey 2014 - Results

The Bersted Neighbourhood Plan Group undertook a survey of all Bersted residents and businesses in April 2014.

Around 4300 were posted with a pre-paid response envelope included. 691 responses were received which represents a 16% response rate.
