With Levelling Up funding for the Alexandra Theatre and the development of the Place St Maur, I welcome the announcement from the County Council to allocate £431,000 for further design and survey works to The Esplanade Public Realm Improvements Scheme. This scheme is planned to created better accessible from the seafront to the Place St Maur and the Town Centre.
